WAY on the results of diamond drill hole 79-6 drilled on the company's copper property 8 miles southwest of Kamloops.

B.C. The hole was collared 1,200 feet east of the Python shaft and drilled at a declination of -45° on a strike of 280°T. Complete analysis of the mineralized sections are: 150 ft. to 160 ft., 10 ft. of 1.01% copper, 0.12 oz. gold per ton; from 180 ft. to 190 ft., 10 ft. of 1.04% copper, 0.024 oz. gold per ton and from 220 to 230 ft. 10 ft. of 1.10% copper, 0.026 oz. gold per ton. The composite section from 150 ft. to 230 feet averaged 0.58% copper and 0.035 ozs. gold per ton.

The resampling of the Python zone where exposed in the underground workings has just been completed. The previously calculated tonnage of 219,700 tons has been confirmed but with an appreciated average of 1.13% copper. Gold values are highly variable but average 0.017 oz. per ton.

The president says that a major mining company has indicated an interest in operating and placing the property into production. Negotiations are underway.

Mr. Southwell also states, "A proposal to build a brewery on the SE crown grant is also being considered taking advantage of the pure water supply developed from previous drilling. A report on this project will be forthcoming after the principals visit Canada towards the end of April 1979."
