① Tenajon Silver is set to begin work on its two northern British Columbia properties, the Horn and Bon Accord, after delays due to a late spring.

A 2-phase \$315,000 program is under way on the Horn. Tenajon's silver prospect near Kinaskin Lake in northwestern B.C. First phase, geological mapping, prospecting and trenching to establish targets, will be followed by a \$240,000 diamond drilling program to begin in late July, 1981.

Results of exploration by previous owners which indicated the presence of silver mineralization, the best zone grading 11.4 oz. silver per ton, were confirmed last year by Tenajon.

Work has begun to locate and reopen the old workings on the Bon Accord property near Stewart, B.C. The \$50,000 program will include mapping and sampling of the upper adits to be followed by \$100,000 worth of diamond drilling if successful.

The presence of mineralized material assaying in the range of 0.10 to 0.15 oz. gold per ton and two to four oz. silver per ton has been indicated by previous operators on the Bon Accord property. Results also suggest the presence of lead and zinc.
