

Newhawk Gold Mines Ltd. has reported that exploration crews are now at work on the gold property near Nuttlude Lake in northwestern B.C. Planned for this summer is a program of surface prospecting, sampling and geological mapping to attempt to establish the continuity of the main Hawk vein. The company's commitment to the work is 50% of the total \$65,000 estimated cost to be shared by joint venture partner Northair Mines Ltd.

An evaluation of the Sno claims near Kamloops, B.C., has been completed. Geophysical/geochemical surveys and geological mapping were conducted as well as diamond drilling totaling 666 meters in five holes; however, no mineralization of commercial value was indicated. Minimal further work is planned at this time.

United Westland Resources Ltd. has reported that the Robert Moore No.1 well was connected to the pipeline last week and is currently delivering 1,500,000 cu.ft. of gas per day. Work has commenced on connecting the Terrell No.1, Jesse Moore wells 3, 4 and 5, and gas sales should start shortly. Wilkin No.3 was fraced this week and will be on the line next week while the Wilkin No.4 has reached its projected total depth of 15,400 feet and so far encountered potential production in the Austin Chalk, sub-Clarksville, Georgetown, Edwards Lime and Edwards Reef.

The company will start its first exploratory well on the Fayetteville 3780-acre block in the first weeks of July. This well is scheduled to be drilled to a depth of 14,000 feet.

The company will start drilling 8 consecutive wells in Throckmorton county, testing 8 separate reef structures to a depth of 5,000 feet.

GCNL #130 JULY 9, 1981 TENAJON SILVER CORP.

TWO EXPLORATION PROGRAMS - Tenajon Silver Corp. is now set to begin work on its two northern NOW UNDER WAY B.C. properties, the Horn and Bon Accord.

A two-phase \$315,000 program is underway on the Horn, Tenajon's silver prospect near Kinaskin Lake in northwestern B.C. First phase geological mapping, prospecting and trenching to establish targets will be followed by a \$240,000 diamond drilling program to begin in late July 1981. 1980 work by Tenajon confirmed the presence of several zones of significant silver mineralization, the best zone measuring 45 meters by 4.2 meters grading 11.4 oz. silver per ton; one selected sample of native silver taken across 5 cm assayed 789.01 oz. per ton and a barite vein showing some copper and lead mineralization returned 73.03 oz. per ton silver over two meters.

On the Bon Accord property, comprising eight Crown grants located 12 km north of Stewart, B.C., work to locate and re-open the old workings has begun. The \$50,000 program will include mapping and sampling of the upper adits to be followed by \$100,000 of diamond drilling if successful. Exploration by previous operators of the Bon Accord indicates the presence of significant tonnages of mineralized material assaying in the range of 0.10 to 0.15 oz. gold per ton and 2 to 4 oz. silver per ton. Results also suggest the presence of lead and zinc.
