b) Mineral deposit

The mineralization consists of argentiferous galena, cadmium bearing sphalerite and some copper minerals occurring in and on the margins of a granite porphyry stock of small dimensions and rhyolite in tenure.

c) The mill is presently operating at a planned rate of production of 40 tons per day. As the mill is not insulated for winter operation, production will cease in October or November of this year and resume with the Spring break-up in 1975.

These claims and crown grants are located in the Omenica Mining Division near Cronin Creek. The old name of the mine is the Cronin Mine.

b.) Description of the mineral deposit:

The minerals mined are silver, lead, zinc cadmium, copper and gold. The deposit is a vein and fracture type mineralization in a rhyolite. The fractures have been traced for some 1600-2000 feet in length and vary in width from a few inches to 15 feet. The fracture zones are shorter but reach 50 to 80 foot widths of lower grade.

The mine has been developed over 4 adit levels and on an internal incline over a vertical distance of about 500 feet and a total mine development horizontally and vertically of some 4000 feet.

b.) cont'd

The following ore reserves have been calculated based on the surface work and mine development:

46,752 tons indicated (probable) and 130,000 tons inferred (possible) at an average grade of 12.52 oz. Ag/T, 7.11% Pb, 8.12% Zn, 0.1% Cd.

c.) The rate of production of the minerals:

Production during 1973 consisted of 3,000 tons mined and 1700 tons treated in the concentrator (mill) located on M.C. Sunrise #7. This produced 86.2415 tons lead concentrate and 79.7460 tons zinc concentrate which was shipped to Cominco, Trail, B. C.. The settlement from these shipments show:

10.738 oz. Au, 8124.8 oz Ag, 2967 lbs Cu, 92.738 lbs. Pb, 109,195 lbs. Zn and 1121.98 lbs. Cd.

This gave a revenue of \$66,141.35 less freight of \$8,121.70 and smelter charges of \$9,805.15 for a net return from the smelter of \$48,214.50.

The above was produced during a period of 66 days for an average treatment rate of about 25T/day. The company intends installing an additional ball mill this spring to bring production up to 50T/day. The property is now shut down for the winter and will be opened up in the first half of May.

I hope the above information is satisfactory and apologize for the delay.
