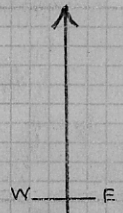

 Mining Divisions)

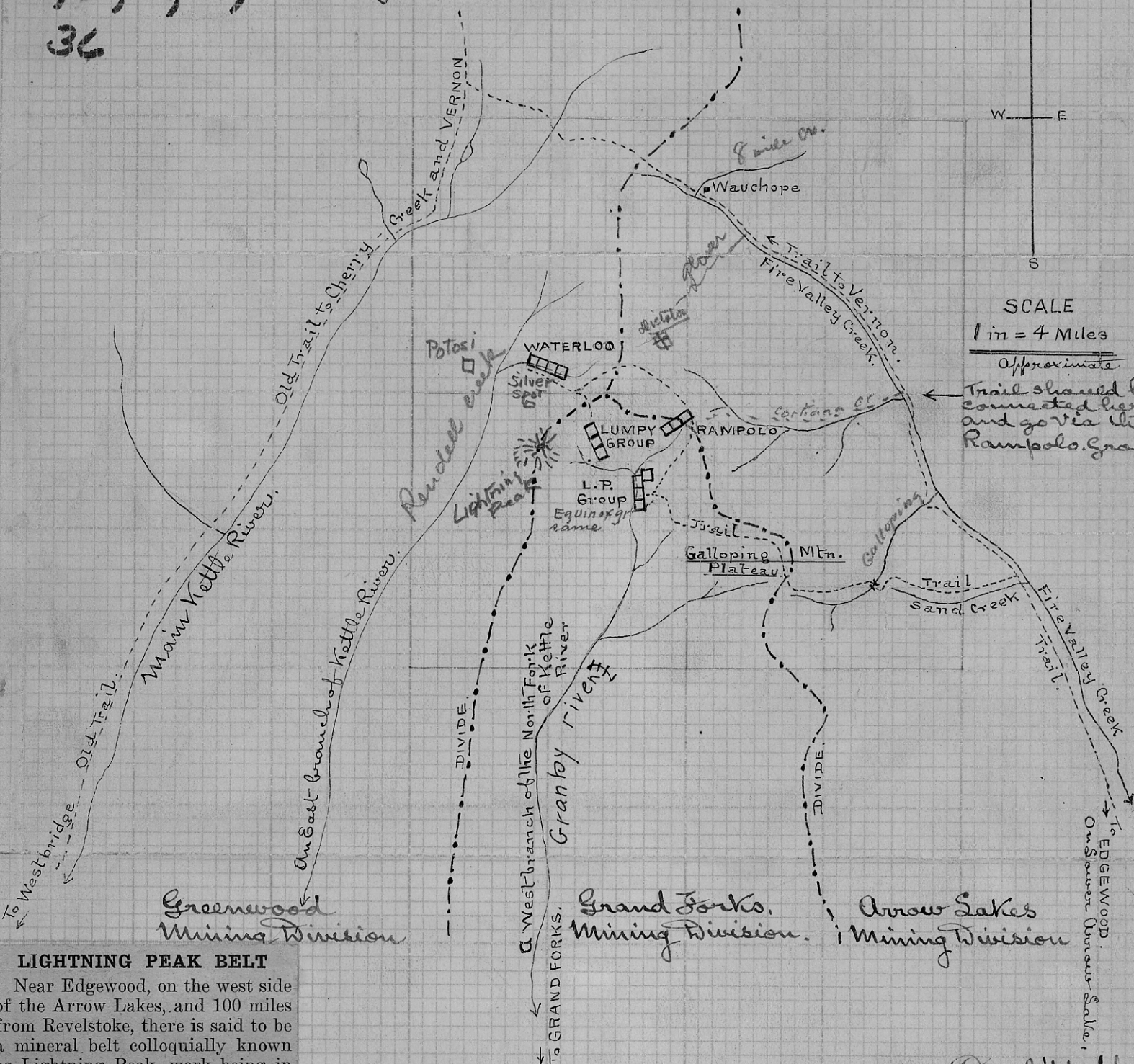

LIGHTNING PEAK BELT

Near Edgewood, on the west side of the Arrow Lakes, and 100 miles from Revelstoke, there is said to be a mineral belt colloquially known as Lightning Peak, work being in progress on six properties in this locality, the Waterloo, Dictator and Extension, Silver Spot, Rampolo, Lightning Group and Lumpy Group, high grade ore now being shipped from the Waterloo, it being the intention to continue work all winter. Some fine ore is being taken from the Rampolo. Camp is being built and supplies secured. The ledge on the Lumpy Group is said to be 60 feet wide and to give values of 145.5 oz. in silver, with a picked sample showing 675.5 ounces at the grass roots. A pack trail being the only means of reaching the new section, it is understood the government will be appealed to build a road into the properties.
