K I N G G R O U P
of Mining Claims

- Location** - On the lower Arrow Lake and about a mile southwest of Renata, B. C. There is a road to the lower end of the claims.
- Claims** - Three. These claims are surrounded by open ground except for a single claim under other ownership.
- Owner** - F. R. Rickward, Renata, B. C. and R. D. Cook, Silverton, B. C.
- Work** - Three open cuts and a little stripping, on ore.
- Geology** - Limestone cut by four or more porphyry dikes striking northeast.
- Veins** - There are no proper veins, but the limestone along the dikes is mineralized with quartz, disseminated galena and a little zinc; the silver is low.
- Values** - The ore is claimed to carry 15% to 20% lead.
- Ore specimens shown consist of silicified limestone with finely disseminated galena and a little zinc. Guessed (by C. C. S.) to run about 10% zinc lead.
- Price** - \$20,000 on "terms".

Comments by C. C. Starr - It seems possible that this ore could be shipped crude to the Trail smelter rather cheaply by water to West Robson and then by rail, and that payment would be made for lead, silica, and lime, and possibly a little zinc and silver.

I judge the ore might be spotty and the property worthless, or if the spots or lenses are large enough it might turn out to be a big mine of low grade ore.

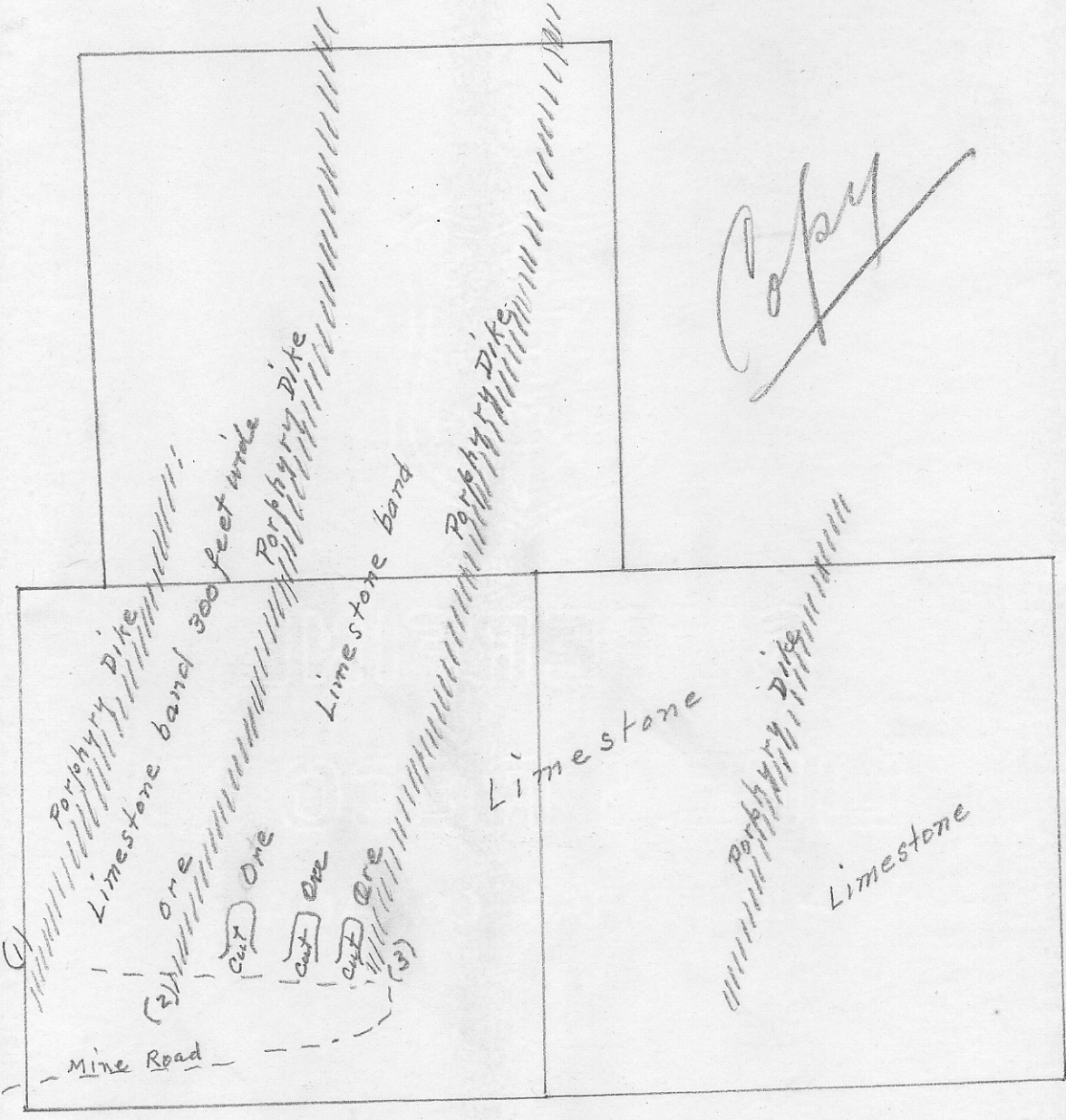
