- at headwaters of Silver Spray Creek
- "The engineer's report described the vein as being ten feet wide in which were narrow stringers of ore averaging from 300, up to 2000 ounces silver, & 2 oz gold per ton"
- in early '60s Peterson et al reported open cuts which yielded but are filled with slabs, boulders of granite. He reports pay streaks in tunnel "narrow & in scattered pockets". "The considerable width of the lode, described in the ministry of mines report, was only the distance between two high fissures in the solid granite, & the whole could not be of commercial value. The fabric of the property reported on drawing the tunnel above & underneath the high grade surface showing."
- Peterson staked property & renamed it Silver Spray
- reports of spectacular ^{native} Au & Ag
- inside volcanic pipe
