In reply to your letter dated October 25th, we are sending you the following information on the Boomerang Mine.

Boomerang Mine. Location-Slocan, B.C. 49 117 N.E. Enterprise creek.  
Year 1956.

Ore shipped 3 tons.

Assay Silver 144 Oz. Lead 266 lbs. Zinc 271 lbs.

This is the last information in the minister of mines report. The Boomerang and Richmond recorded mineral claims are situated on the south side of Enterprise Creek, about 12 miles from the Slocan City-New Denver highway. The claims were worked by the owners, George Foster and P.A. Ward of Trail. The workings consist of two adits and a small stope, which were worked in the early part of the century. Ward and Foster drifted around the caved stope, but their efforts were hampered by an unexpected break through into the stope. A compressor was winched up to the workings from the Enterprise Creek road.

There are four other Boomerang Mines in B.C. but none in this vicinity. We hope this is the information that you want.
