ADDENDA TO REPORT ON THE RED ROCK GROUP

Dated Dec. 8, 1929.

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An adjoining group of claims has now been added and the whole is known as the BLACK HAWK GROUP; it is now controlled by John Falls, Waneta, B. C.

No additional work has been done since the former examination.

Since the snow is off from the property it is apparent that the vein, which strikes about N 10° E and dips nearly vertical, cuts the formation both on the strike and the dip, as the formation strikes about N 40° E and dips 70° southeast.

The vein has not been traced for more than 100 feet, but its possible width is greater than the two and a half feet sampled in December, as there is weak mineralization in both walls which havenot been crossed. The topography suggests that the vein may extend at least 500 feet to the northward toward the contact with granite which is about a thousand feet north of the shaft.

The occurrence is in a fissure diagonal to the formation and therefore of a different type to the ore-bodies of the Reeves-MacDonald mine which are in sharp folds in the limestone. It does not now appear that a geological study of the property is justified (as was recommended in the original report).

The showing is however worthy of further work which had best be done by the owners. If such work is reported as favorable another examination would be in order.
