


HALL CREEK SLOPE of SILVER KING MT., NELSON. BRIT. COLUMBIA.


WORKINGS of the FLYING DUTCHMAN

From "Bear Mine" at 5000'


Looking into "Noman Creek".

opposite side.




LOOKING S.E. from "LIBERTY-LORNE GROUP"

The "Gold Fern Mine" and the "Bear Group" are developing and shipping gold ores to the Trail Smelter. The Canadian Girl" and the "H.B. Group" are under development. The H.B. Group of the Liberty-Lorne Gold Mines, Ltd., of Five Claims, extend to top of Ridge.



