
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CALGARY – Sasko Oil and Gas is to spend about \$250,000 this year on a program of surface drilling at its <u>Winslow</u> mine, a former gold silver producer in the Revelstoke area of Southeastern British Columbia. The program will represent the

/ The program will represent the first serious evaluation of the former producer by Sasko, The Northern Miner is advised by Jeffrey D. Ross, the company's vice-president of operations. Sasko principals have held the Winslow property since the 1950s. The mine was in production during the Second World War.

In other developments, the company is concentrating the bulk of its 1983 exploration budget of \$1.7 million on ongoing drilling in the Waskada region of Southwestern Manitoba where the company expects to participate in the drilling of 18 development wells following a current program of six wells.

At the company's recent annual meeting, shareholders were told that results from five Sasko-interest test wells at Waskada could lead to the drilling of up to 50 wells on Sasko lands over the next year.

Shareholders were also advised of successful "new" oil participations in Alberta.
