PROSPECTING REPOR

CAMBOURNE PROPERTY

One prospector and assistant worked on the April group of claims from June 21, 1974 to September 21, 1974.

On May 8, 1974 a reconnaissance trip was made to the property. Purpose of this trip was to establish a suitable campsite and availability of communication, fuel, food and supplies. Road conditions were also examined and found to be acceptable for the type of equipment we would be moving in.

On June 20, 1974 a camp, consisting of a 32' x 10' trailer (capable of sleeping nine) and fueling facilities, was moved from Calgary, Alberta. It was set up one half mile south of the mill in the old townsite of Cambourne.

A program of locating old trails to the workings was immediately started. We located, cleared and marked trails to the following:

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CHOLLA ADIT

OYSTER-CRITERION NO. 2 ADIT

OYSTER-CRITERION NO. 3 ADIT

ROSSLAND LEVEL

LUCKY JACK VEIN SHOWING (700° in length)

LUCKY JACK ADIT

The Eva vein system was also explored and trails marked to the following:

EVA SHAFT

HIGHLAND MARY GLORY HOLE

NO. 1-A

NO. 1-B

NO. 5-A

NO. 2-B

NO. 7-A

NO. 3-B

The old adits after being located were cleared of debris and brushed out.

The Eva system of veins were searched for and traced across the "Iron Dollar", "Last Chance" and "Stockholm" claims.

Old workings were investigated wherever found and veins sampled and assayed for gold.

As a result of the foregoing, a road was surveyed up the "Stockholm" claim across the projected vein system. In September the road was bulldozed for one and a half miles and within 50 yards of our projections two quartz veins containing small amounts of gold were encountered.

A small adit, not previously recorded, was discovered on the "Stockholm". It is drifted on what is presumed to be the Eva "B" vein for about 25 feet. Visible free gold was encountered in this tunnel and assayed.

During a field trip in August, a new vein (Tammy vein) was discovered on the "Cholla" claim at approximately 2,100 feet elevation. The vein was marked and sampled.

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Shortly before leaving the area on September 30, 1974 we moved the camp to Beaton due to heavy snow-fall usually received in Cambourne.

The camp was winterized and left as it will be needed for our 1975 Program.

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
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
