Dear Dr. Walker:

As requested, herewith is a little information regarding the Magnet claim at Gerrard.

The band of carboniferous slates altered to graphitic schists has an average width of approximately 50 feet, in the vicinity of the underground workings. The zone of alteration has been traced for 3000 feet in a north-westerly direction from the workings in that direction. Within the schists there have been encountered short lenticular bodies of silver-lead ore. Development indicated that the erratic nature of this mineralization makesit uncommercial. Scattered pyrite and a very little galena occur disseminated through the schists.

Much of this information I obtained from one of the owners of the property after receiving instructions to forward notes to you. As noted in the G.S.C. Memoir 161, the underground workings are at present in poor condition. Surface growth is heavy. However, I believe the information given above to be accurate.
