Re: Unicorn 1 & 2 Claims, Ferry Creek,
Lumby Area, 82L2

On August 26, 1976, accompanied by Ms. Ginger Osterfeld, a mineral showing was examined approximately 1.6 Km above the highway on Ferry Creek. Ferry Creek is approximately 27.2 Km east of Lumby on Highway No. 6.

At the showing site rocks are composed of graphite bearing calcareous argillite and graphite bearing limestone. Attitude of the schistosity of the metasediments is 030° with average $20^{\circ}E$.

Galena and marcasite occur in the central part of a white, flat lying quartz vein. The vein occurs near the high water mark of Ferry Creek and is about 15 M in length parallel to Ferry Creek and about 3 M in width normal to the Creek direction. In the center of the vein, at the thickest portion the vein measures about 20 cms tapering to zero at all visible extremities.

Fine grained, cubed galena and marcasite occurs in dendritic fashion in the center of the vein. The quartz appears to have grown from each sharp-walled side of the vein; no cavities were seen.

Sulphides compose about 8% of the quartz vein material.
