At the request of the Directors of the Company I visited the Sooke Copper Mine and measured the North Drift which is 66 feet in length by 7 feet high and $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet in width. This Drift carries "Copper Ore with a little Native Copper

The South Drift is 90 feet in length and the same height and width as the North Drift in this drift I found nothing but "Native Copper" very rich in places. The length of the Shaft from the Braces is 140 feet the Audit Drift below the Shaft including the open cut is 50 feet. It will be necessary before the Winter sets in to make a small drift about 40 feet long to carry the water off from the shaft otherwise it may be filled by the Winter rains it may be done for about \$50.00

The floor of the shaft is supported by large Posts 12 inches square, the cribbing is composed of solid logs 10 inches thick and 12 feet long

The floor of the shaft house is $18\frac{1}{2}$ feet square the height of the house 24 feet this building is very strong and substantial and will last for many years. From the shaft to the whim is about 125 feet the base of which is 84 feet by 50 feet the beam of the whim is 30 feet long, the drum is $7\frac{1}{2}$ feet in diameter by 6 feet in height with a roof ready for shingling - the uprights are 15 inches square the span beam is the same size and 30 ft long and in excellent working order.

The Work done in and on the mines is very considerable

The foot Drift is 190 feet in length the entrance to which had to be very heavily timbered in consequence of the great height it was from its base, it is now quite secure

The Drift above the Shaft (called the sand Drift) is 190 feet long with a crop cut of 39 feet this drift is finished in a most substantial and workmanlike manner and reflects great credit on Mr. Branche's judgment. There are five houses on the premises including sleeping and dining rooms, office, Blacksmith's Shop and stable. A good deal of the land has been cleared of the heavy timber. The labour of cutting down the trees and squaring them for use and hauling them away has been very great

In conclusion I beg to state that I consider this mine will turn out to be very productive but the shaft has to be driven down much lower than it is at present
