## THE SUNRISE GKOUR

INTHODTCTION:
About four hours were spent on the property, accompanied by Mr. hastad, one of the owners.

LOCATION:
The property is situated on the west side
of Port Eliza Arm, at about the center of its length, and extends from the beach diagonally up the mountain. It is about twelve milea, airline, southwest of zeballos.

PKORenty:
The property consists of eight elnima, held by loastion, and owned by Andy fostad ard gartner of Copeecoe. The claims are the Sanrise Mos. 1 to 6 and the sinnet Nos. 1 and 2.

GENELAL CONDITIONS: Access to the property is now by lanch from Ceapeecee or Zeballos, but if there were suffictent freight the C. $\because$. $k$. ateamer wolld probably call, ne aeep weter extends 6108 a to the propexty. There is a good campsitepesir the vein and a few handred yards from the beoch, where a rreek will furnish watex. Timber for mining purposes is plentifal. The topogrephy is comparstively smooth ant the slope slong the vein outcrop is 15 degrees, or less. The elevation at the Liscovery ost of Sunrise No. 2 claim is shout 226 foet.

DevelombNT: Very little develoment has been done; tals consists of two or three small open cuts and the stripping of the vein at several places.
 brosh, and on aceount of lack of time no study was made of it except iamediately along the vein outcrop. The chief rock appears to he diorite, with some volesnic rocks along the vin to the west. The formations are probatily the same ns those in the Zelallos district.

The vein zone is a wid shear striking N $40^{\prime \prime}$ to $45^{\circ}$ " and dipying $50^{\circ}$ to $65^{\circ}$ northenst. It is scompanied by a highly altered, finc prained, rreenish dike which is spareely inpregnated with fine pyrite and a fen aball yuarta seans. along botin walls of the cike. which is from tour to six feet in width, there is from two to twelye inches of uartz, mostly of the reslacement type. which is often fairly mineralized with fine pyrite. There ars also occusional udartz stringers running out from the vein at stall angles and containing considerabla pyitte. The vein is axposed in the botbor of a small creck at intervela for noarly a thoosand feet from the beach. The groind is too flat for economical developmert bs tannels, and shafts would nave to be sunk on the vein after diverting the creek, or a short distance from the vein in one of the walls. The full vein 13 only exposed at a few points, for the creek swings too much from one side to the other.

SAMPLES \& ASSAYS: The sketch herewith shows the samples taken by the writer, Nos. 405 to 412 inclusive, and also two by Mr. Hostad, and twelve from a report by a Mr. Watson.

My own samples average considerably lower than the others, but I see no reason to doubt their accuracy.

Neither of the samplings show any definite ore shoots, though there are spots of high grade ore, and aspecisilly in one of the hanging-wall stringers over a with of $3 \frac{1}{2}$ inches. This stringer con be traced about twenty feet and narrows as it gets away from the vein.

CONCLUETON: The vein is strong and appears to be continuous for a considerable distance. Essentially, it consists of two narrow quartz veins from two to twelve inches wide, separated by three to five feet of very low grade, highly altered dike-rock. while the sampling of the dike has been cone in only a few places, there is no reason to believe the it carries important amounts of gold at any point. The quartz along the margins of the dike seldom shows sufficient value to make it interesting, when the narrow widths are taken into account.

It would seem that the owners woald be justified in opening up the vein across its full with at closer intervals on the possibility of picking ap a small oreshoot. Any more extensive work seems unwarranted at this time.

I consider the property of doubtful value as a development proposition, and do not recommend its purchase.
