Subject: Full Moon Claim (Lund Area) owned by Grant Keays

Alf, the Full Moon claim is a single reverted crown grant which is covered by mineral claim 258361, recorded in 1987 and is in good standing until 2005. No assessment work has been recorded on the claims, according to our MapPlace, but that could only reflect technical work reports and not physical work. Grant Keays is shown as the recorded holder of the claim, and he also holds 3 other mineral claims in good standing (Holly 1-3) located on Texada Island. I am not aware of any exploration work completed on the Full Moon claim, but the fact that it was a crown granted mineral claim certainly suggests that historical exploration work occurred at this location.

In reviewing the file, it appears that Mr. Keays has been poking around on the property for about 10 years. I am suspicious of Mr. Keays' exploration intentions for the Full Moon claim, and suggest that a site investigation would be worthwhile to evaluate the mineral potential of the claim. There are some MINFILE occurrences located just south of the claim, so it is quite possible that the Full Moon claim hosts similar mineralization. I have included some data from MapPlace and MINFILE for your information. I am due for a return visit to Texada Island in the near future, and could easily arrange a concurrent visit to the Blue Moon, preferably with Mr. Keays.
