Almatex is presently a private 3,000,000 share company, based in Prince George. Its principals are:

> Walter Collos - Pres. Warren Sadler - Vice-Pres. Steve Citynski - Vice-Pres.

Mr. Sadler and Mr. Citynski have been to the office several times of late to brush up on the mining rules and procedures, and have brought me up to date on their current project.

The company acquired 4 placer leases at the head of Butte Inlet, from a prospector, and following successful results from preliminary tests have located additional adjacent leases to a total of 27.

The object of the land acquisition is to establish sufficient reserves of magnetite-rich sands to warrant a commercial operation. The company has employed Dr. D. L. Cooke, 334 Francis Rd., Richmond, B.C. as consultant.

Dr. Cooke's work to date suggests a huge yardage of sands with a recoverable magnetite content of 6 to 15%. Impurities are low and acceptable. It is understood that Japanese interests have expressed a desire to assist in evaluation and finance.

I am also informed that the group has discussed the operation with Fisheries and have had favorable response to preliminary proposals for development and operation.

Since the consultant has advised acquisition of more leases, and since it is a new type of operation, it may be that tenure by means of an exploration lease arrangement could be considered and instituted.
