

BATTLE CLAIMS

Follow-up of the Nasparti Cr. geochemical anomalies of rock and stream sediment samples was carried out during the first week of September 1973. A two-man fly camp was flown in by helicopter from Port Hardy. The camp was established in order to thoroughly prospect the Battle claims area for a potential massive sulphide copper deposit.

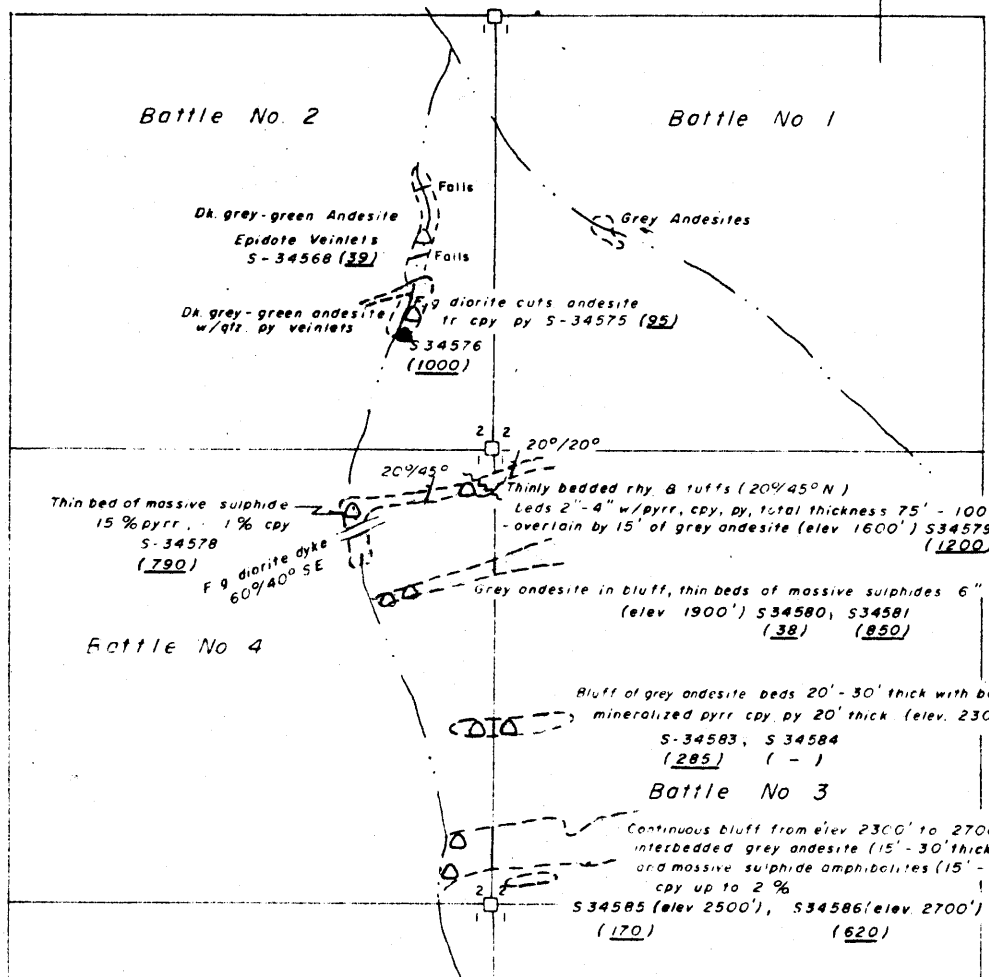
The area is composed mainly of andesitic flows with interbedded chert, tuffs, andesites and amphibolites which strike approximately N50°E and dip 25° to 40° northwest. Many narrow (1-2') andesite and fine-grained diorite dikes cut the volcanics at random. A small stock of diorite intrudes the volcanics in Battle claim 2. No alteration accompanied the intrusive. The bedded volcanic sediments form a 100 to 200-foot thick sheet between andesite flows.

Copper mineralization occurs almost exclusively in the bedded volcanics, particularly in several chloritized amphibolite horizons ranging from 3' to 30' thick. Chalcopyrite, pyrite and pyrrhotite are the main sulfides. Pyrite, up to 15% is generally disseminated throughout. Pyrrhotite is sporadic but when present may constitute 20% of the rock. Chalcopyrite is very sporadic, occurring as isolated blebs and rarely as continuous narrow bands. The most favourably mineralized beds are very local in areal extent, outlining an area of 200' x 200'. These two beds are approximately 30' thick, and show sporadic chalcopyrite.

Mineralized fragments of float occurring along the east side of Nasparti Creek were traced to their origins. They were found to originate in thin beds of chert and siliceous tuffs containing small blebs of chalcopyrite (less than ½ percent).

Prospecting up the remaining geochemically anomalous streams resulted in finding no other copper mineralization of economic value.
