The Johnson was  
a good man who lived  
at Keeley Creek.

Dear Sir:-

Received your reply and Bulletin #21 enclosed.  
How about gold having been recovered from Shoal's  
Creek.

I do not know for sure as this to be a  
fact, but following up an old story was able  
to locate the possibility.

It seems<sup>in</sup> that in 1939-40, a prospector by  
the name of Johnson was supposed to have  
done so. In following up this story, last  
summer did locate a diggings.

This digging consisted of a hole to the  
depth of 24 ft and a small drift about 7 ft  
on bedrock. This hole was about 5' x 7' square  
and all cribbed with split cedar poles (a beautiful  
job) to the depth of 18'. We believe at this stage  
he hit gravel and from this point on did  
any pan work that was done. The 7 ft drift  
was well timbered and as near as we  
can tell well cleared out, not being able

to do any more in this hole as he had hit a pocket in bedrock.

The tale also stated that around \$50,000<sup>00</sup> worth of gold was taken from this area.

Mr. Johnson who had been in contact with certain people was not seen after the spring of 1941, at which time he was to be going back into the same area, so it was on this tale we investigated.

I now have a small placer lease covering the findings, and hope to do some digging this coming season.

If we should have any success I will let you know.

Does the Government Royalties also cover minerals found under this procedure?
