**YELLOW MOOSE (NTS 93F/6, 11)**

Cogema's Yellow Moose property was briefly investigated. The property occurs south of Arrow Lake approximately 20 km west of the junction of the 500 Road and Holy Cross Road and is accessible by the Knewstub access road. A single outcrop of rhyolite tuff, rhyolite breccia and crystal tuff to crystal lapilli tuff (weakly plagioclase phyric) was looked at. A sample flag bearing the number YM043R was found and the location was sampled (BL-YM-1).

The rocks are generally clay altered and fractures are coated with iron oxide and manganese stain.

Another showing on the southeast shore of the lake was not examined due to time constraints.

An outcrop about 4 km from the showing on the Knewstub Road consisted of the redish brown poorly lithified mudstone to conglomerate identical to the outcrop seen on the Holy Cross property.

A DIGHEM<sup>V</sup> electromagnetic-resistivity-magnetic-VLF survey was flown in March, 1993.
