OWEN LAKE PROPERTY - HOUSTON, B. C.

HISTORY

First reported discovery in 1916 exposed three roughly parallel veins. In 1928 F. H. Taylor optioned the property, stripped the most northerly vein, and in 1929 sank a shaft on the cole vein to a depth of 85' and drifted from the bottom east and west for a total distance of 120'. After this preliminary work, attention was focused on running a 6x8 crosscut tunnel to penetrate the Silver Queen and Cole vein systems at depth.

In 1961 the property was optioned to Denison Mines Ltd. whose self-potential survey and soil sampling program on the claims indicated three anomalies to the south-west of the Cole vein and shaft. Frontier Exploration in 1964 tested the two most interesting anomalies by a series of bulldozer trenches which were not sufficiently deep to satisfactorily explain the cause of the anomalies, although alteration zones as associated with other veins in the area were exposed.

As recommended by our Consulting Engineer, some size and persistence of the Cole vein as well as the two strongest anomalies indicated on the map as the Jack and Axel anomaly, were tested during the 1966 season by shallow diamond drilling. The favourable results and confirmed mineralization are described in detail on the following pages.

OPTION AGREEMENT CHANGED.

The property was purchased by Frontier Explorations from Jack Goold of Houston B.C., and prospector Axel Berglund of Prince George B.C., on an option basis of \$50,000.00 and 150,000 shares of a new company to be formed.

Option agreement now permits Frontier Explorations to elect on June 1 1967 to form a new company or retain the property within the company by issuing 100,000 shares of escrow stock of Frontier to the prospectors.

PROGRAM FOR 1967

In view of the recent success by Nadina Mines Ltd. which has a similar geological setting, and with improved base metal prices, more diamond drilling is planned. First work will be concentrated on the Axel vein to extend it's length and depth. An exposed showing south of George Lake on strike some 2,000' from drill hole No. 5 may be a possible extension.

Negotiations to acquire a fast mobile drill unit to either core or percussion drill are being considered.

Work on the property should resume in March so that all equipment can be moved in before Spring breakup restricts road travel.


