

OMINECA - OSILINKA LIMESTONE BELT

A program of detailed mapping and prospecting was carried out by Northwestern Explorations, Limited in the area between the Omineca and Osilinka rivers west of the Wolverine Range in the vicinity of Nina Lake.

In the upper portion of a limestone member of the Cache Creek series, lead-zinc mineralization had been noted. The belt, some 30 miles in length, was mapped and prospected in detail and some stripping and rock work done on the showings. A pack trail 25 miles in length was cut from Nina Lake to the Davies showing on Osilinka River. A crew of sixteen men was employed for a period of four months.

activities in Northern British Columbia.

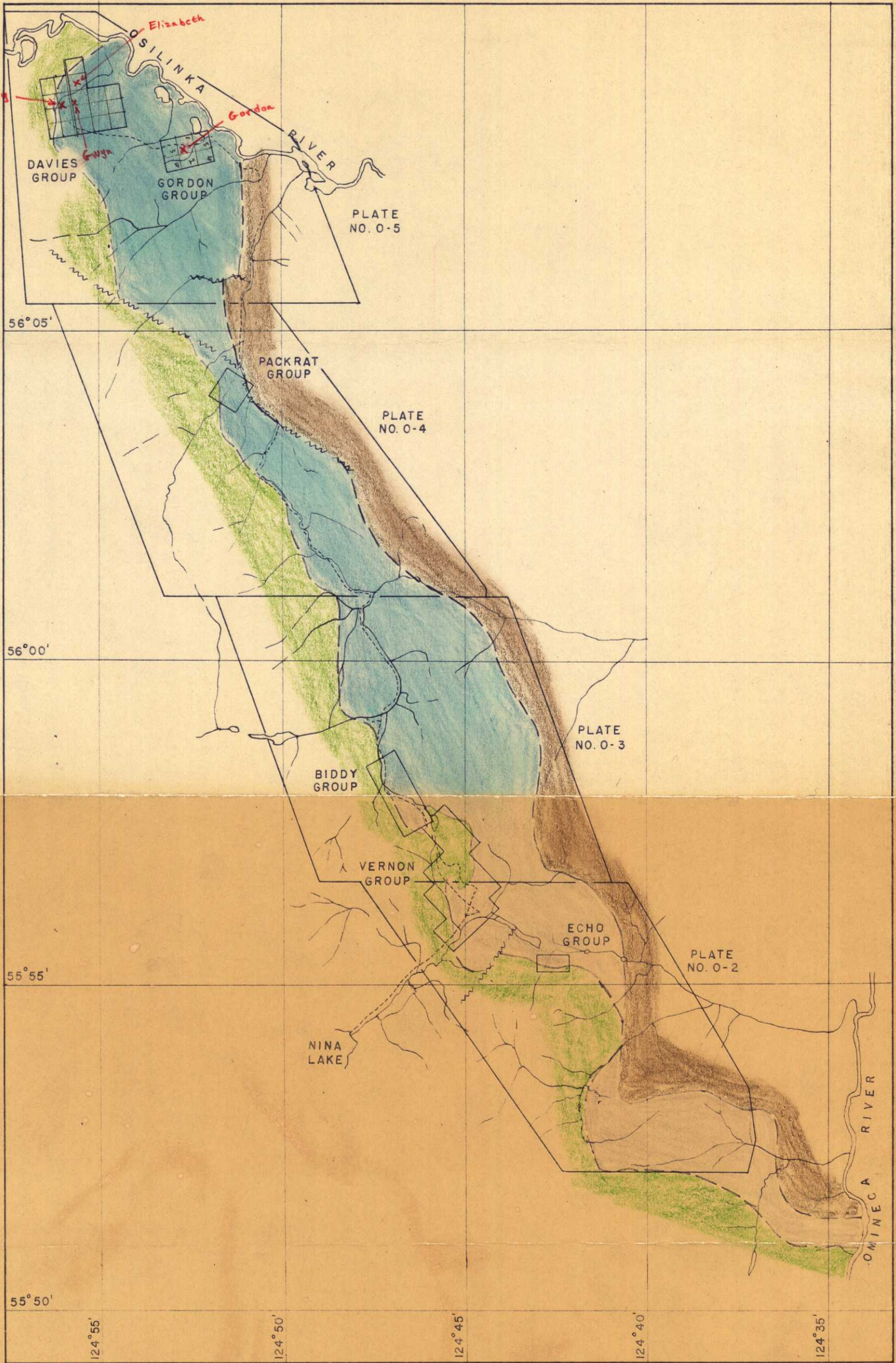
I would have liked to visit your crew in the Omineca

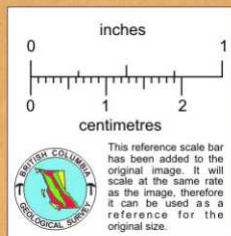
