Re The Mineral Claims (6)
the old Apex Group.) "Star," "Roy," "Rand"
the old McMurtry Group) "Imperial," "Keltic L" & "I. G. C."

The surface showing on "Star" Mineral
Claims is 140 feet long by 300 feet. This is
traced clear across the property by 3 Leads 100
feet apart to the "Imperial" Mineral Claim,
where it comes to the surface again. 194 feet
wide & 400 feet long.

There is 306 feet of Tunnel on the "Star"
Mineral Claim, giving a depth of 125 feet. And
100 feet of Tunnel on the "Keltic L" Mineral
Claim, with a depth of 75 feet. It is 3000 feet
from the surface showing to the other, with
iron ore cappings between. Also running
down the hill from the leads for 1000 feet.
There is plenty of timber on the Claims. And
one of the best chances for Water power in
the country. Two Lakes drains from 2 different
parts of the country. One Lake 1 1/2 miles long
by 1/2 mile wide. The other Lake one mile by
3/4 mile wide. Both forming the same river
