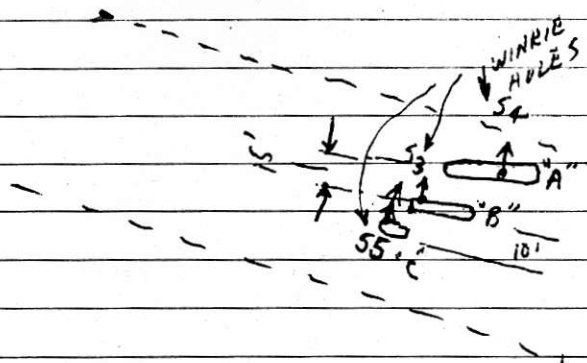

Dear Bob,

Following is in reply to yours of October 21st.

There was a fundamental difference between the Waller and Russell sampling. Dick felt that he was always going NEARLY ACROSS THE STRIKE. I felt quite sure (and do yet) that the trenches are at an angle of about 30° to the strike. Rather than quell his enthusiasm I let him go ahead.

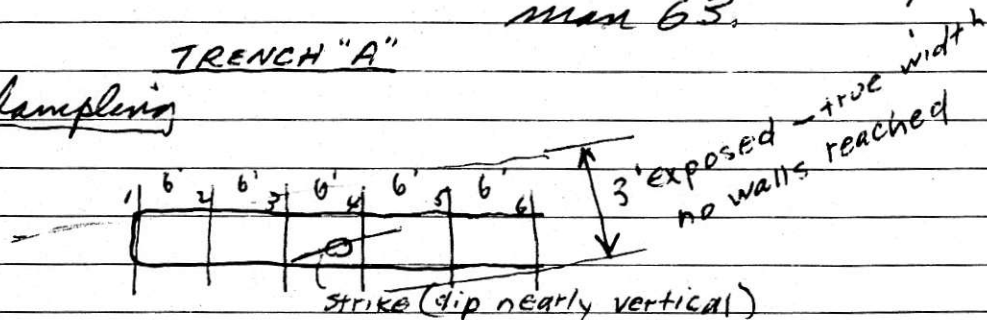
The significant point is that at no place has the sampling cut completely across the no. 8 or the no. 5 zone. The sketch at left illustrates my interpretation of the no. 8.

TRENCH "A"

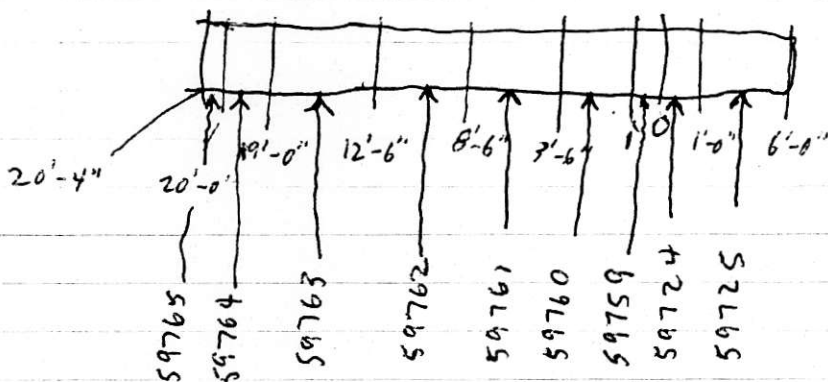
Russell sampling

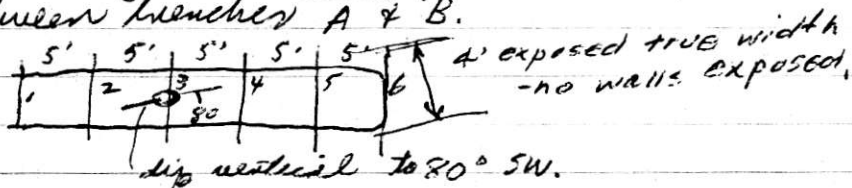
Jack was asked Diels to break up the sampling into individual samples and diels sampled the face PARALLEL TO THE WALLS OF THE TRENCH

Vein covered between Trenches A & B.

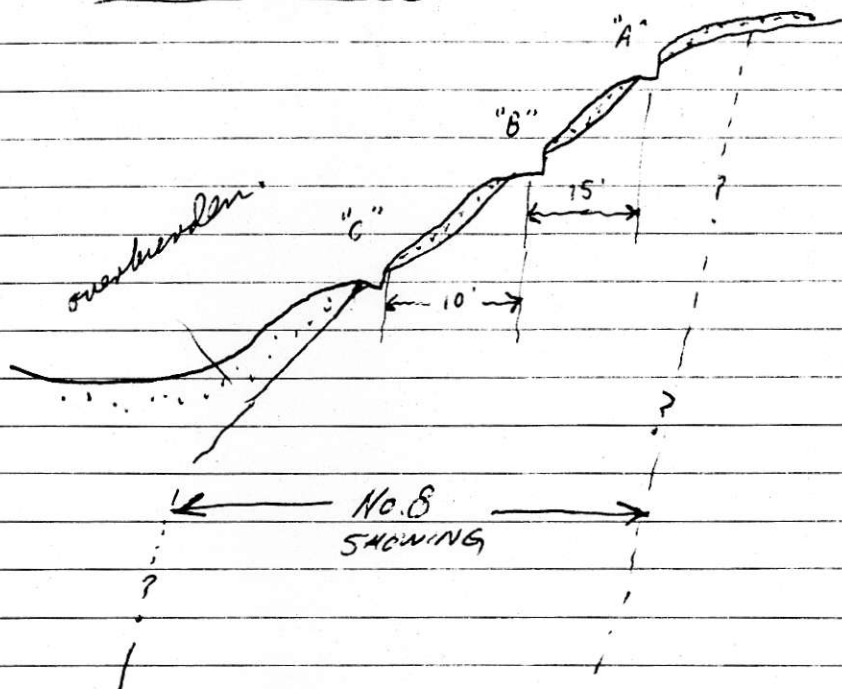


Note: - I checked my notes - map should read 6 chip samples 5' apart over a strike length of 25'

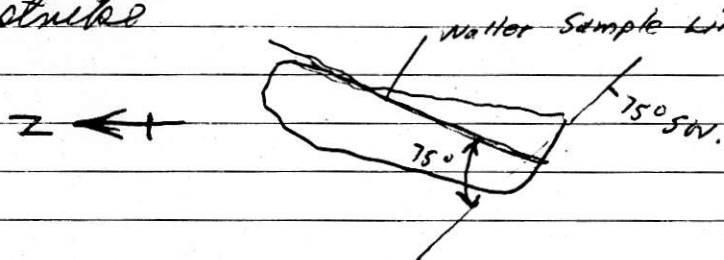
SAMPLE 59723 (G.A.R.) - Composite sample - all chips from the 6 lines shown in one bag.

The ground is, again, all covered between Trench "B" and Trench "C". Trench "C" was so oxidized I didn't sample it. Diels couldn't get a good face broken. To sum up I have shown my idea of the showing in cross section on the next page.

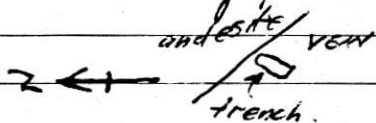

In regard to the Waller sampling on the No. 5 zone (Winkie Holes 51 and 52) - his line of samples was much closer to being taken across the strike



I would give his sampling a true width of 11'. Also, hole S-1 got into ~~an~~ amygdaloidal andesite so I would say the trench is located very close to the fault wall. Here again, the full width has not been exposed



I hope this will clear up the things. If not - let me know.
