

The Sand mineral claim, consisting of 20 units, was staked by Specific Natural Resources in March 1979 to cover a large gossanous area containing copper and malachite mineralization. All holds of Specific were later transferred to Esperanza Explorations Ltd.

The property is located in the Clinton Mining District of B.C. between 5000 to 8500 feet elevation at the headwaters of Sand Creek, an easterly flowing tributary of Mosley Creek. ~~Access~~ Access to the area is via helicopter from ^{the village of} Tottle Lake, ~~40~~ ⁴⁶ kilometers ~~to~~ ^{to} the northeast. Road access is also possible along a private road to Twist Lake which passes within 3.5 kilometers of the property.

The first known work in the area was conducted by Pacific Petroleum Ltd which staked the UB claims in 1970 and during 1971 carried out geological mapping and ~~defined~~ ^{defining} a low grade MoS₂.
