Subject: PROGRESS REPORT, Easy Project, Likely, B. C.

Geochemical and assay results from sampling mentioned in the July 6 progress report have now been received as follows:

- 1. Chip and Soil Samples collected by Mickle LK7 LK 44 from central June Claim (near Quesnel Forks), from Doug Claim (adjoining June on the east and straddling Cariboo River), and from open ground between Doug and Easy claims returned little better than background results for all determinations.
- A single high soil value (1440 ppb Au) from central June Claim was resampled. This sample (LK6) gave a second determination of 620 ppb suggesting that free gold may be present. The sampled soil on examination proved to be rusty decomposed bedrock. Adjacent rock (rhyolite fragmental) returned 740 ppb where a few quartz stringers could be seen and 90 ppb where none were observed. N.B. 1440 ppb = 0.04 oz./T
- A sample of massive pyrite from a narrow (1"-2") vein exposed in an old cut on Cariboo River in the May Claim returned less than 10 ppb Au and 0.1 ppm Ag. A specimen from a nearby adit (collapsed) gave 30 ppb Au and 5.6 ppm (0.16 oz./T) Ag. Mickle has subsequently done cat trenching in this vicinity and currently is doing some diamond drilling with his own equipment.
- 4. Rock geochem samples of quartz veinlets taken from the bed of Fisher Way Creek in Easy 5 Claim returned background values.
- A request by Mickle for release of newly-staked claims (May, June and Doug) was complied with under terms (right of first refusal) of the agreement. His request for release of Easy 6 has not been granted as per letter of July 17, 1979.
