In checking into the Iva Fern Group, I have difficulty in determining where the workings and outcrops are located on the group. If the main workings are on the Iva Fern and Standard we should tie Morris up right away, as I note from the enclosed sketch which I made that it would appear that the Black Cap is a small claim within the group and the Excelsior is far down on the end. Perhaps from Morris and Mulholland could be found out where the workings are. It might be satisfactory to tie up Morris and we would then have the major part of the group at least. I wonder if you could see Morris or Mulholland and find out just where the workings are and send me down a sketch. The Ivaand Fern were to go up for tax sale this year and Morris apparently paid just enough to keep them out of it. I would be pleased to have the location of the workings as soon as possible.

In locking up these claims I notice a tremendous amount of staking has taken place on Burnett Mountain a mile or so away, and there are three groups staked called the Shanrock, Pass and Paddy. I wonder who has been in the area doing this?

Just from the location of the claims I would say that Morris holds the key to the situation.

The Mines office here has no record of Weaver having title to the Excelsior or the Black Cap. This might be worth a further check in Nelson, either the information sent to the Vancouver offis is wrong, or these claims may not be in Weaver's name.
