CHIEF ANALYST AND ASSAYER.

In March 1957, fire destroyed much of our laboratory and equipment. We have established a temporary laboratory, in which we test every prospector's sample(s) for most metals. On each laboratory report (your report is attached hereto), we state any metals we found in amounts that exceed those normally found in rocks. We also include any assay results on gold, silver, and radioactivity.

We shall be unable to test for a few metals, none of which so far has been of commercial interest in British Columbia. However, we are retaining your sample(s) on file until we are again equipped to test for these particular elements, and you will be advised of any further information we then obtain on your sample(s).
