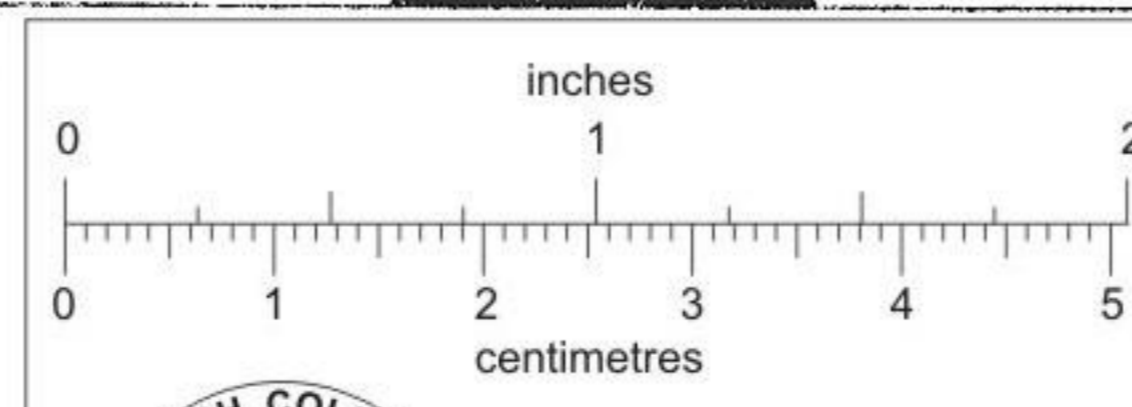
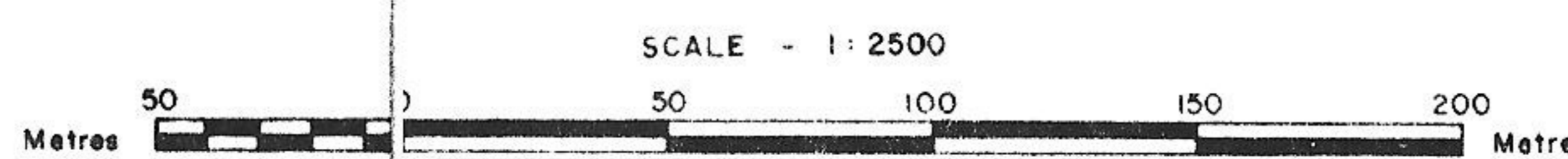
Composite Section A-B-B'-C, showing soil sampling results in oz/metric ton gold, and percentage copper, plus possible drill holes.

Subsurface geology is unknown, though diorite sills have been noted in the footwall of magnetite skarn zones carrying copper and gold. Some sills are mineralized.

A recovered grade of 0.03 oz/ton gold, plus 0.3% copper and 0.1 oz silver would have a net smelter return of \$20 to \$24 per ton at current metal prices. Rock grades can be determined only by careful sampling. The soils are unusually rich in metal (uncut average, 0.05 oz/ton Au, 0.15% Cu)

Drill test suggested - 625 metres (about 2000 feet)
