Dear Mr Brock.

Enclosed are all the materials I have been able to gather up concerning my copper property on the Gynnoety (Copper) River near Terrace. I won't even list the items, as I am continuing efforts to obtain additional materials previously held by Metron when they had the property.

I consider that this property has a good possibility of additional undiscovered deposits, but has yet to receive an adequate exploration program. As you can see by the enclosed soil map, copper anomalies persist up to the edges of the area gridded and sampled - a strike length of 7000 feet. at 500 feet spacing, these lines are a pretty loose net to catch the smaller ore pods.

The property is a helicopter show at present, as the Copper River bridge at Salmon Run has not been rebuilt since it washed out in 1974. It will have to be rebuilt in order for the logging company to get to the timber on the sides of the mountain which has barely been scratched by the earlier logging episode. There is a B.C. Hydro Transmission line crossing the property and a Pacific Natural Gas pipeline. The smelter site study being conducted by the B.C. Government appears likely to choose Kitimat

as the smelter location, about a 65-70 mile road haul from the property.

I have staked a lot of ground around this property in order to present a clean package. I expect that much of it will eventually be allowed to lapse as it is reevaluated.

There is a fair road on the property from a B.C. Tel facility on the mountain to the site of the former bridge. It passes right by the No-1 zone, and is about 8 km in length. Every fall the B.C. Tel people clear the trees and rock off it and repair the culverts.

The season is quite short on a property at this elevation, and I am afraid a lot of the field season has already gone by for this year. A decent camp is essential. It is far beyond my resources to work this property alone.
