Here's the whole stutere dumped on your lap. You will have hours and hours of fun separating the Monzonites from the quartz monzonites. Before, I had said that the fracturing in the creek was basically E-W, but now after looking at the diagram of the creek I think the flat faces of OC. I was seeing are caused by fracturing along the lines that are faintly dotted in. The rock faces face E-W, not the fracturing. I'm wrong and the revised fracturing doesn't make any sense don't tell me 'cause I'll cry.

About that gully to the ~~NE~~^{NEastish} of camp that you wanted sailed - I'm not too sure whether we hit it. It's kind of hard to tell by the air photo and it's impossible to tell when over there 'cause there are so many little gullies.

Up on the hill to the SW of camp were orange flags D-603 and in the fault there were a couple of D-724 and D-725 silts.

As far as the ~~the~~ BURN CLAIMS are concerned? you have the rocks and can see what is in them, I think they should be registered. Looking at the subsonic steps I think it may be wise to plunk in a few claims 'cause those are the ~~best~~ most positive results I've seen from this Echo #2 and #3 area. But that will be better decided after the geochem from the lab in Van is back. Maybe if there were a few extra days near the end of the season someone could come in for a few days and put in another line or two of claims. I'm afraid the claims were staked on the 14th of July (the 1 in that 14 was made very small) if you want to bullshit them to the 24th.

A few words about the BURN GRID. On the 10th of August I sent you a note about duplicates in some of the soil sample numbers. I over-looked an important fact. The samples I said would be marked "a" had been sent in earlier on the first box of samples to come out of this camp (#5). The second set of numbers from the extension of the original 6 claim grid was brought in when the claims were registered. If the samples are still at base and have been hung out to dry in the same grouping they were sent in it may be possible to mark one set - if not, tough shit. Some of the samples came from the same holes and because of the different directions of the lines in the two grids the duplicates are only every 400 feet, so I guess all is not lost.

Also about the grid, specifically the lines near the East end. They are very poor soil-wise. There used to be a big piece of rock there but it broke into a thousand little pieces. Now it just lies there hiding the B horizon. In all the last 4 lines were the shits.

To the purchasing department, I didn't mention in my soil-sample-bag note to DVL that I would like to buy a clip-board with a leather pencil-thing on it.

I assume Echo is going back to the peak area in the long swamp camp (#4). If we do, what will we do for 10 days? Unless we stake and do a grid I don't think there is enough work in that little area for a full 10 day camp.
