

MISCELLANEOUS:

1. I don't believe that the unit 4a volcanics are Sloko-equivalent. They seem interbedded (or at least conformable) with the top of the Cache Creek Gp and (from Sunday Peak) conformable with the base of the Laberge Gp.

2. We staked 18 units (3W by GN) under the name TURTLE 1 to protect the ground. If geochem is favorable, these should be recorded, and the following is suggested:
 - a) More detailed mapping of the skarn horizons (a 4x ^{or 8x} enlargement of part of BC 5500 #124 would be suitable).
 - b) Magnetometer survey across limestone and limestone/volcanic contact.
 - c) Soil sampling for skarns would not be much use: the limestone/granodiorite contact is well exposed and the mag should find skarn on the limestone/volc. contact.
 - d) More detailed and careful ^{rock} sampling. (mainly of skarns).

3. No evidence of previous prospecting was seen (but the gossan above Turtle Lake is very outstanding).

4. There are lots of bears around here (one of which is guarding a rock hammer and a pair of safety glasses).
