Re: Chain and compass survey of $P B$ Group mineral claims in the Fish Lake Area, southeast of Kelowna, British Columbia.

The following is a general outline of the problems encountered by the stakes of this PB Group, using the 2 -post staking method;

PB 251 and 2,52
Shaker intended to secure ground south of PB 182, but placed on the claim tag and document the request for 1500 ft. right of location line. This resulted in drill holes $B C P 45$ and 46 situated in open ground, and now covered by Kettle \# 12.

PB 187 and 188
Staker installed final post of PB 187 and 188 in excess of 1500 feet beyond the initial posts of same, thus creating a large fraction between PB 187-188 and 191-192. This was a very common occurrence during the acquisition of title under the 2-post system.

PB 183, 186 and 193
Staker intended to throw the claims to the right of location line, but noted on both the claim tag and document that he was requesting 1500 feet to the left of location line, thus leaving a large area of open ground now covered by Kettle \# 12, Kettle \# 22, and Kettle \# 23.

Several minor errors were encountered during our examination, but are not noteworthy enough to bear discussion in this outline.

In summation, may I note that we have surveyed approximately 3000 mineral claims under the 2-post system in the past 15 years, the most notable of which are Lornex Mining Corporation in the Highland Valley area, and recently Afton Mines Limited, located just west of Kamloops, B.C. In all cases, including the above, open fractional ground was discovered during our surveys. Most stakers encountered both physical and interpritive difficulties in applying the 2 -post staking, and it was rare indeed not to have problems of the variety noted in the PB Group discussed herein.
