Re: Riverside and Imperial Properties, Kettle River

- 1. On or about the end of July, 1967 I told Cam Stephen it was O. K. for him to work within the 30 mile circle centred on Beaverdell.
- 2. Cam examined a number of old showings in the 30 mile circle, returning to Vancouver on October 6th, 1967.
- In the Vancouver office library, Cam found three separate files referring to a property or properties under the names - Riverside, Imperial Mine and Jack Paul Mine. He consolidated this information and found assay plans and an engineer's report that was of some interest.
- 4. Cam showed me the data and, on November 8th, he, Bruno Goetting and I visited the property and examined the more accessible underground workings.
 - No one from the mine, at least to Goetting's knowledge, had ever visited the property, and there was no information on it at the mine.
- 5. Upon receipt of interesting assay results from samples taken during the examination, I suggested to Cam that he talk with the owners during the course of the Northwest Mining Association Convention in Spokene December 1, 2, 1967. On doing that, Cam discovered that Mr. Frank Marr effectively controlled the important claims and so reported to me on his return to Vancouver. I reported to you immediately thereafter.
