GENERAL COUNTRY ROCK IS SERPENTINE AND BASIC INTRUSIVES. THE PROSPECT AREA WOULD NOT HAVE BEEN PICKED EXCEPT FOR THE COINCIDENCE OF ^① THE PLACER STORY AND ^② THE SPINES OF RESISTANT DYKE OR VEIN MATERIAL AND ^③ THE WISH TO INVESTIGATE THE INTERSECTION OF A LANDSAT SOUTHEAST LINEAR AND AN ARC SHAPED STRUCTURE. THIS IS SHOWN ON THE ACCOMPANYING XEROX + OVERLAY

WOULD EXPECT QUARTZ CARBONATE MARIPOSITE ZONES.

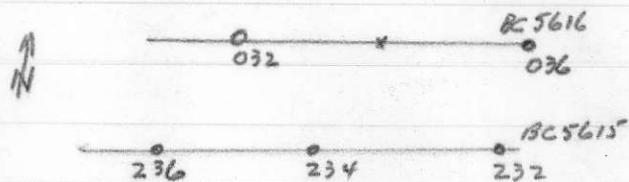
