To get you out of the snow + cold for a change I would like you to move back to Atlin. June 24 AM, take the green truck to Watson Lake and contact Jake Melnychuk.

Jake has a property on the Liard River which straddles the BC-Yukon border. I looked at some of the showings on the BC side a year ago last March but have not seen some of the showings on the Yukon side. All showings and nearly all outcrops are along the river bank and this is not really the best time to look at them but I think you could do a tape and compass traverse along both river banks to tie in the geology in a rough way and it should be possible to sample some of the showings.

Jake has indicated he would arrange to use a river boat to get you camped on one side + then come back to move you to the other side.

Mineralization is primarily galena sphalerite with some silver but there are narrow breccia vein zones with tetrahedrite and some apparently conformable massive pyrite. Rocks are primarily sediments with some barite. Structure is much folded and faulted. Ken Addison is supposed to be doing a large program a few miles north.

You will be staying at the Watson Lake Hotel the night of June 24. Pick up groceries + naphtha at Campground Services at the far end of town - charge to our account there + mark N.Y. Syndicate. Hotel + meals to be charged to our office.

You might see whether 1:50,000 maps are available at the Mining Recorder's office but otherwise there are no base maps available of adequate scale.

The purpose is to tie in the showings in a rough fashion, get an idea of their size and chip sample for assay. Information is to be made available to Jake - no deal has been entered into and assay + appearance would have to be fairly good for us to pursue it. Jake can tell you when best to leave the truck. Would like to have you back in Atlin July 1 or 2.
