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Report on Graham Creek Prospecting Area.

Introduction: ~~Q The mouth of Graham Creek~~
Graham Creek flows southerly into Graham Inlet approximately 20kms WNW of Atlin B.C. A small amount of placer gold has been recovered from the upper parts of the creek and a small amount of hardrock mining was undertaken at one locality.

Camp was situated on the east side of Graham Creek between the first and second tributaries from the creek's mouth. The creek was fast flowing and wide averaged 2m. in width making it difficult to cross. Camp was located among willow bushes ~~and~~ which offered shelter from the wind. A helicopter pad was cut closer ~~near~~^{to} the creek. Vegetation essentially consisted of willow bushes ~~and~~ some spruce trees ^{and} buckbush and grass and moss at higher elevations. (~~5,000'~~) Elevation in the area varies from ~~a~~ 3500' around the creek to 5,000' on the surrounding ridges. Outcrop is ~~only~~^{exposed only} abundant in the creek itself and on the very tops of the surrounding peaks and ridges.
