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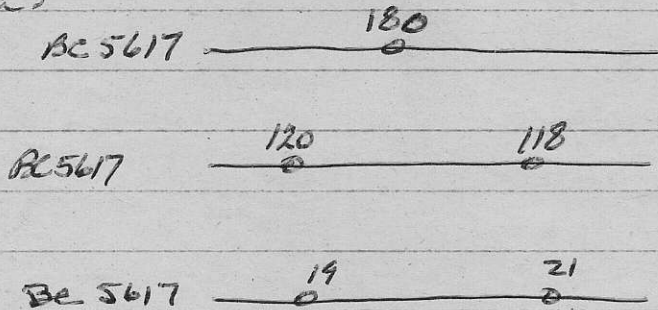

The Mineral Inventory maps indicate a prospect for asbestos and copper 1.25 miles (2.01 km) north west of the peak of Mt O'Keefe and another 2 miles due west of the peak - mineral ?? maybe mesquite. (3.2)

We understand from Darryl that native copper was found in the area and Larry Nagy of Cominco tells me Cominco had two feet of massive chalcocite in 1954. He is not sure they even assayed for Au Ag.

The photos provided are at the limit of the coverage we have on file. Hope they cover the area.



Possibly Darryl can spot you right on one of the showings.

Although your rock samples from Terror Creek showed considerable mineralization, especially copper, we have sent them only for Au Ag assay since I assume the qtz veins are some distance apart - are small, and, unless they run very high in precious metals, will be uneconomic when averaged with country rock. Await your report.
