Re: Lytton Minerals

J. M. Carr remarked that the most interesting area he saw this past season was the copper prospect near Pitguah north-east of Lytton. Drilling was to have started here in January to investigate a zone of radiating fractures carrying copper values over widths of 50 to 100 feet. Drilling is in hopes of outlining tonnages for underground mining at 1.5% Cu. Carr feels the grade indicated by what he has seen is more likely 0.8% and thinks an attempt should be made to outline open pit ore. I get the impression funds and planning were for only a small drill operation over a great strike length and will in no way be adequate.

Carr suggests the Mount Lytton Batholith deserves further prospecting particularly the narrow fault blocks or wedges north of Lytton Minerals in the vicinity of the Victory claims.
