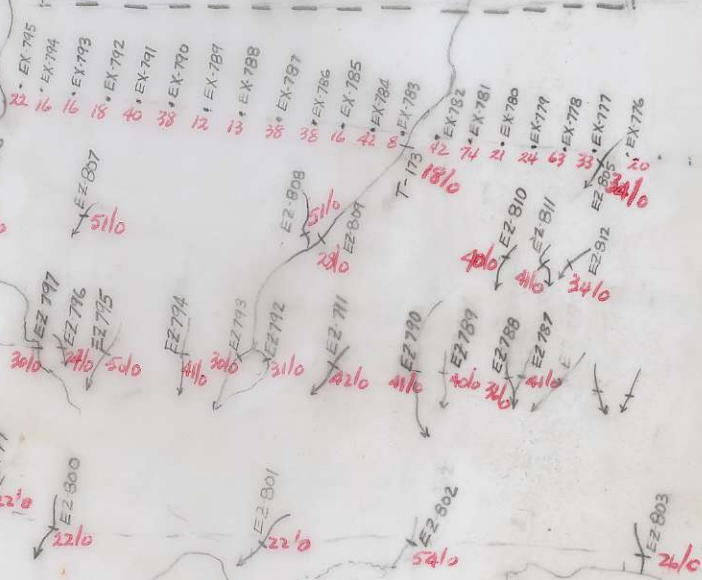

P.S. Thanks very much - really enjoyed living at the cabin & be able to go swimming - really nice

Anyway, we silted primarily out to west - most of the creeks were dry gullies but we took anything that even looked like it might have had water in it during the last 10⁶ years.

Most of the creeks disappeared up higher so we put a soil traverse with 400' spacing ~ 1000' south of the claims. Lots of vgh bush in the concentration area - no O.C. except on the east

borders of it (even in deep creek ravines - all overburden - we dug around a bit with the grub hoe). Found a bit of pyrite in one rock on the Hill claims north of camp but very minor - fairly large O.C. with py in a very small ~~area~~ area only. There has been quite a lot of staking in the ~~area~~ eastern part of the concentration area previous to the Hill claims - are there mag. anomalies or was it chiefly speculation after the discovery of Belle Granisle? - doesn't seem to be anything else ~~where~~ which would be cause for ^(over) ~~over~~ ^{I want my} ~~mommy!~~
