The camp is in and one drill is operating.

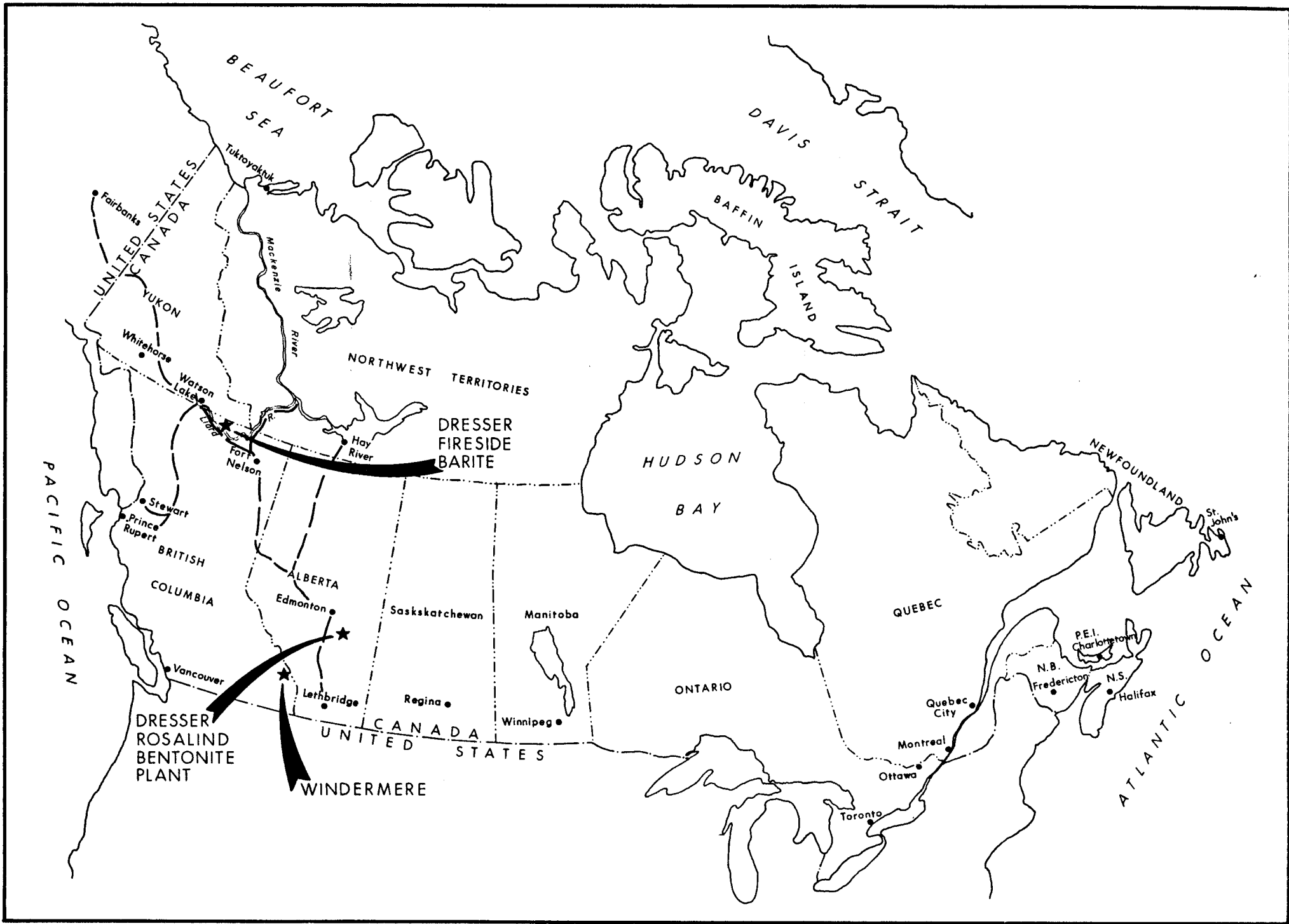
A crew is setting up jigs for beneficiation from waste piles. There is still snow in the bush and some roads are sloppy. Access to the Bear area should be OK by mid June.
