I have compiled the following data on mineral reserves and resources at Windy Craggy and adjacent areas.

RIME, East Arm Glacier: ca. 100 million tonnes, unspecified grade  
Windy Craggy Mtn.  
North of Frobisher Valley  
Northwest, north and east of Tats Lake

Estimated potential within 25 km x 20 km area: 500 million to 1 billion tonnes of mineralized material (G. Harper, Ibid.)

#### ADDITIONAL RESOURCES NOT KNOWN TO GEDDES

Four new occurrences discovered by geologists with B.C. Geological Survey during regional mapping in 1992, in zone trending NW, 7 km wide, within 15 km of Windy Craggy:

RAINY MONDAY: est. 26 Mt (600m x 100m x 150m) of material grading up to 20% Cu, 2.4 g/t Au, 39 g/t Ag, 0.27% Co

ICE BRIDGE: up to 0.46% Cu, 0.41% Zn

TEQUILA SUNSET: 20 x 100m exposed, up to 1.5% Cu, 0.5 g/t Au

SKID: up to 1.56% Cu, 0.22% Zn

No drilling or systematic evaluation of the above discoveries has been done. These occurrences conservatively double the previously estimated resource, i.e. 1 to 2 billion tonnes of potentially mineralized material exist in the immediate vicinity of the Windy Craggy proven reserves.

In addition to the above tonnage and grade figures, I enclose a copy of a White House memo and a related Mining Association of B.C. memo for your interest. If you wish any additional data, please let me know.
