Dear Sir,

Geddes Resources Limited have carried on a continuous exploration program on the Windy Craggy Property in the Haines Triangle of northwestern B.C. since 1987, and have spent some \$36 million to identify 119 million tonnes of 1.9% copper, 0.08% cobalt, 0.19 g/t of gold and 3.7 g/t of silver to date. This program will continue in 1990 from the 45-man camp and airstrip located near Tats Lake (See attached location plans.).

The mineral potential of this area does not seem to be appreciated either publicly, provincially or federally. As a result of this lack of knowledge, recreational, wildlife and park interests are agitating for exclusive control in the area. The B.C. Government have already established a recreational corridor on the Tatsenshini and Alsek rivers and have removed that area from mineral or placer claim staking.

This letter is written to suggest that with the Geddes Resources Limited continued activity in 1990, it would be timely for the Geological Survey of Canada to assign time, effort and money to conduct a survey of the mineral resources of the area. On the basis of a cost/benefit analysis it can certainly be demonstrated that development of mineral resources should have an economic benefit to Canada equal to or higher than the exclusive use by recreational, wildlife and park interests.

At your convenience we would very much like to discuss this whole issue with you.
