Dear John:

Received your letter O.K. and was glad to hear from you. About those claims of mine on Grouse Mt. I have seven claims. There are two leads on them, one is nine feet of ore and the other four feet. I haven't had any Assays made in the last two years. The Assays three years ago gave me 11% copper on the big lead and 9 oz. silver and a \$1.60 in gold. On the smaller lead I got 16% copper, 3 oz. silver and a trace in gold. I can send you some samples as soon as I go to Telkwa. I am willing to give a good company any kind of deal they want. My price is \$2500.00 per claim. If cash or \$3000,00 on a bond I will give them twelve months time to prospect the ground and pay in two years. One payment in 12 months one in eighteen, and the final in two years.

Everything is about as usual here. We are having very cold weather 38 below today. McNeil is working the mine full blast, three fours hauling. Car Wakefield is head, Skinner and Goodwell is driving Prince in the mines. Haig and Affeck are both working.Jerry Hauley is running the engine and pump. I am hauling ties for Murray. The Government crew are building the new bridge across the Telkwa. They are busy at the concrete.
