Dear Bert:


Glen Phillips asked me to send you one of the brochures he prepared for us.


Dear Bert:

I have reviewed the report on the Jake claim and conclude that there are some similarities to the Sylvester K property of Ken Daughtry and Associates; ie. within units of the Brooklyn Formation, having some areas of stratiform, conformable mineralization, some gold values in skarny rocks and a magnetic anomaly.

I would recommend a quick reconnaissance Magnetometer and VLF EM survey to the north in the "proposed exploration area" before a decision is made on optioning. If the zone is continuous it can easily be picked up by VLF as was the case at the Greenwood property.
