## WESTMIN RESOURCES LIMITED SIGNIFICANT DISCOVERY AT MYRA FALLS

**Vancouver, B.C. (May 1, 1995)** - Westmin Resources Limited announces that a second hole drilled into the North Downtrop region from the Lynx Mine has encountered high-grade ore within H-W type stratigraphy. The hole has encountered multiple zones, two of which are detailed below and more are still being assayed.

**Hole No. 15-502, Inclined -47°, Azimuth 346°**  
**Coordinates at collar 44+92N, 10+10E, elevation 3204m**

The new discovery, which is in the North Downtrop region, has been named the "Marshall Zone" after Westmin's Chairman. It is located within H-W age stratigraphy, but is different geologically - more like the Ridge East Zone. The tonnage implications are significant because this is the first ore in this region found north of the North-Downtrop fault. It is also situated above the H-W haulage level about 900 metres northwest of the current Battle Zone development.
