

INTRODUCTION

This report is prepared at the request of
La Baron Gold Mines Ltd. (NPL) with officest 5707 Monarch
Street, Burnaby, British Columbia.

LOCATION AND ACCESS

The a & W group is located on Sowaqua Creek, a tributary of the Coquihalla River. They are located about 14 miles northeasterly of the village of Hope, B. C. The approximate geographical location is 49 -27' north latitude and 121 -10' west longitude.

Access to the claims is by a fair jeep road up the Coquihalla River, following the old road bed of the Kettle Valley Railroad as far as the mouth of Sowaqua Creek. Thence up the Creek by a rather narrow jeep road to the claims. This section will have to be widened and improved when exploration of the property is started.

TOPOGRAPHY

The topography is quite rugged. The valley floor is narrow and the hillsides rise steeply from about and elevation of 1500 feet to 6500 feet or more.

TIMBER

The area is well wooded with stands of fir and cedar. In places alon the small creeks and slides underbrush can be thick and troublesome.

CLIMATE

The climate is mild but snowfall is excessive from November to March some exploration work can be done then but the field season is from May to October.

When mining operations start they can be planned so that snow conditions will not hinder work too much.

WATER - and fine our property

Amply water for all mining, milling, diamond drilling, and domestic use is present.

POWER

No close source of hydro-electric power is present. Hence diesel-electric power will be required in the early stages of exploration and development.

SUPPLIES

Mearly all supplies can be purchased at the town of Hope, 14 miles westerly. If they are not available there they can be obtained in Vancouver within 14 hours.

LABOUR

There is a large labour pool of experienced miners, diamond drillers, and geophysical crews at Hope.

ACCOMODATION

There is no accommodation or housing present on the property and a tent came will be required.

CLAIMS

The a r V group consists of 12 claims all held by the right of location. The Record Numbers are 29432 to 29493 and the tag numbers are 487309M to 487320M. The claims were recorded at the office of the Mining Recorder at New Westminster on August 14th, 1974 and are in good standing until 1976.

No apparent contraventions of prior locations appear to be present or show on the claim affidavits.

The group contains about 600 acres, more or less.

ADJACENT PROPERTIES

Numerous claim groups have been staked in the area and active exploration is being done on many of them. The largest of the groups is held by Carolin Mines Ltd. (NPL) and are situated seweral miles to the west. They hold some six square miles of claims. Here as of July, 1975 the have announced estimated ore reserves of a minimum of 3,500,000 tons grading o.114 troy ounces of gold per ton and show that a 2,000 ton per day mill is feasible. Exploration work is continuing.

The A & W group has similar but unexplored geology.

GEOLOGY

Not enough work has been done on the claims to map the geology or rock types present. Poor exposures show slates, greenstones, some serpentine, and narrow basic dykes. Quartz vein float has been found and it is thought that by close prospecting they may be found in place. Rock ages probably range from the Cache Creek series of Pennsylvanian age to the Ladner Series of Upper Jurassic age.

The rocks are of potential economic importance and warrant prelimary geological exploration.

CONCLUSTONS

As mentioned in the previous paragraph some work should be done on the claims. It is desirable that this be started as soon as possible. Such work to consist of:

- 1. Improve road access to claims.
- 2. Survey claims by chain and compass.
- 3. Make a magnetometer and geochemical survey.
- 4. Map geology.
- 5. Bulldozer strip any anomalous zones found by surveys.
- 6. Do a limited amount of diamond drilling on target zones.

ESTIMATED COSTS

My Table of Estimated Costs to carry out the above program is shown in Appendix "A" of this report.
