

Dear Mike:

The following are my comments with respect to Barringer Report #258 received in today's mail.

The new geochem. data fit, and extend the currently plotted anomalous areas. However, with the exception of 305, 14E @ 1100 Mo and 325, 14E @ 70 Mo, the Mo results are not spectacular. Naturally my final evaluations will hinge on the correspondence of the sludge assays pending with the geochem. data.

In contrast, however, some substantial coppers appear; these areas may warrant additional detailed sampling with follow-up drilling - where not previously tested.

A. Roberton of Barringer notes that "305, 14E may be high in other metals, shall we get a spec. analysis done?" You can check with Mike Wetherly and advise Roberton on this.
