DEAR JIM:

ENCLOSED IS A COPY OF THE ASSAY REPORT ON
YOUR SAMPLE FROM DOUG PATERSON. AS THE CHARGE IS
ONLY \$5.00 I WILL PAY THIS AND ADD IT TO MY GENERAL
ACCOUNT WITH KENNEDY SILVER.

THE ASSAY RESULTS ARE VERY ENCOURAGING - PROVIDED
THAT ALL, OR AT LEAST $\frac{1}{2}$ OF THE REPORTED 25'-30'
WIDTH OF THE VEIN ARE SIMILARLY MINERALIZED; IF THIS
IS THE CASE IT DESERVES A HECK OF A LOT MORE
INVESTIGATION!

FOR THE PRESENT I WOULD RECOMMEND THAT YOU
TIE UP THE PROSPECT AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE - WHICH
MIGHT INVOLVE MAKING A DEAL WITH DOUG, AND
STAKING ADDITIONAL (?) 'PROTECTIVE' CLAIMS. IN THE MEANTIME
I WILL TREAT THE ASSAYS AS STRICTLY 'CONFIDENTIAL'
INFORMATION FOR YOUR PERSONAL DISCLOSURE AT THE
RIGHT TIME - WHICH I WOULD THINK WOULD BE WHEN
YOU HAVE A DEAL ^{WITH DOUG}, AND ALSO SOME CHECK SAMPLING AND
ASSAYING ACCOMPLISHED (AND A GEOLOGICAL APPRAISAL BEFORE
CONSIDERING POSSIBLE JOINT-VENTURE SITUATIONS).

RE: YOUR EARLIER LETTER (RECEIVED JULY 5TH), I WOULD
RECOMMEND LOOKING AT YOUR FREHMO'S SHOWINGS (A % COPPER
IN FAIRLY WIDE VEINS IN SEVERAL PLACES), EVEN IF THEY
ARE ON E&H GROUND. DEALS WITH LANPAC (E&N) USUALLY
INVOLVE RATHER STIFF ROYALTIES, MODERATE WORK
COMMITMENTS, AND RESTRICTIONS RE- WORKING ON TIMBER
LANDS. HOWEVER, THESE OBSTACLES CAN BE TAKEN CARE OF
IF AN ORE SITUATION IS INDICATED.

THANKS FOR YOUR JULY 9TH NOTE JIM. I WILL WRITE THOMAS TELLING HIM WHAT INFORMATION ON THE O.K. IS REQUIRED FOR AN ADEQUATE GENERAL ASSESSMENT OF THE PROPERTY AND THAT WE HAVE HAD A PRELIMINARY LOOK COURTESY OF MIKE. HE MAY CHOOSE TO FORWARD THIS VIA MIKE, WHICH WOULD BE QUITE IN ORDER.

FOR THE PRESENT, AS I SEE THE SITUATION ON THE BASIS OF DOUG'S STATEMENT CONCERNING VEIN WIDTHS AND THE RESULTS OF A SINGLE GRAB SAMPLE, I WOULD GIVE DOUG'S PROSPECT PRIOR ATTENTION. AT PRESENT GOLD AND SILVER PRICES THE SAMPLE RESULTS INDICATE A GROSS VALUE OF ³ 18.43 PER TON; IF A MODERATE AMOUNT OF LEAD MINERALIZATION IS PRESENT (SOME GALENA NOTED IN THE SAMPLE BEFORE TURNING IN FOR ASSAYING), THE GROSS VALUE WOULD BE HIGHER THAN THIS. FROM THE PRESENT, ADMITTEDLY LIMITED EVIDENCE, I WOULD EXPECT THAT AT LEAST 90% OF THE GOLD & SILVER VALUES WOULD BE RECOVERABLE.

HOPES YOU GET YOUR \$24 PER LB. AND THAT THE WELCOME CHANGE IN THE WEATHER BRINGS BETTER FISHING. THE WEATHER HERE HAS BEEN SO COOL AND WET THAT MY ITALIAN BLAHS HAVEN'T DARED TO SHOW THEIR HEADS - HOWEVER, THEY MAY JUST DECIDE TO COME UP DURING THE CURRENT "HEAT WAVE"!



(the young fellow who was with us) found.
He tells me it crosses a creek with
overburden on both sides. I would
like to have it assayed for gold and
silver unless you think it is of no
value. If you have it assayed send
me the bill and I'll forward a
check.

Another friend found 4% copper in
fairly wide veins in several places
close together, but in E & K ground.
Would you think it worth while to
follow up? It is down Island.

We are on strike at present but
I am hope full that it will be
settled by the week end. We are after
45¢ a lb. and the companies have come
up to 41¢ for sockeye and 41¢ for large
red sprats.

The cost of nets is up 20%.
